# SUNDAY XVII OF ORDINARY TIME

True wisdom is Union with the Holy One | Participation in the divine life is of the greatest value

## Wisdom prized

"Precious beyond gold or jewel I hold Thy law. Prized be every decree of Thine; forsworn be every path of evil-doing. Right wonderful Thy decrees are, hard to read, and well my heart heeds them. Revelation and light Thy words disclose to the simple. Rises ever a sigh from my lips as I long after Thy covenant." - Psalm 118 (119): 127-131

### Truth and honesty

"Men could not live with one another if there were not mutual confidence that they were being truthful to one another.' The virtue of truth gives another his just due. Truthfulness keeps to the just mean between what ought to be expressed and what ought to be kept secret: it entails honesty and discretion. In justice, 'as a matter of honour, one man owes it to another to manifest the truth.' The disciple of Christ consents to 'live in the truth,' that is, in the simplicity of a life in conformity with the Lord's example, abiding in His truth. 'If we say we have fellowship with Him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not live according to the truth..." - Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2469-2470



## Seeking union with God

The rich man, being rich, often enough simply attempts to be richer. We know this, we see it around us, we may feel that desire for greater wealth ourselves. But the rich man of our first reading today had a different idea. Being the king not of a gigantic empire as those surrounding the Holy Land, but of the tiny nation of Israel, he still desired to be a good and honourable ruler, and he asked for the wisdom to achieve this. The Holy One is overjoyed, because this request is a reflection of His own dynamic of love and justice; He immediately granted Solomon not just the wisdom he requested but the riches and long life he had not. S. Paul observes in the second reading that God does cooperate with and bless the good works of His friends, as He had done with Solomon. The pursuit of divine wisdom in the Old Testament is paralleled with the pursuit of communion with God in the New Testament, and this *holy communion* is the belonging to Holy Church that grants us our Christian identity - this reign of Christ over our hearts that is called the Kingdom of Heaven.
