

The silent Presence

The prophet Elijah's flight from Israel to mount Horeb is significant because of the location. It was there that Moses had received the Ten Commandments and the religious Law of the Hebrew people centuries before, and Elijah sought guidance there when persecuted by the wicked queen Jezebel. He may have been looking for great miracles like the pillars of cloud and fire, and the separation of mighty waters (that had accompanied the mission of Moses) to protect him from Jezebel, but in our first reading this weekend, Elijah discovers the presence of the Holy One as much in earthquakes, winds and fire, as in the quiet of a gentle breeze. Elijah's mission would be completed without earth-shaking miracles. And neither will the mission of the Church. It is in the silence of faithful and devoted hearts that the Christian mission will be accomplished. As in the gospel reading, faith will tread over the turbulent waters of this life without sinking, and when the Lord has climbed once more into the boat of the Church, the so-called 'barque of S. Peter,' peace will have returned.
