# Imitating the humility of Christ

"Nothing rouses a great and philosophic soul to the performance of good works so much as learning that in this it is God. likened to encouragement is equal to this? None. This Paul well knowing, when he would exhort them to humility, first beseeches and supplicates them..." -John Chrysostom, his homilies

#### The mission of the Church

"...the Church, although it needs human resources to carry out its mission, is not set up to seek earthly glory, but to proclaim, even by its own example, humility and self-sacrifice. Christ was sent by the Father 'to bring good news to the poor, to heal the contrite of heart,' 'to seek and to save what was lost.'" - Lumen Gentium §8, of the second Vatican Council

#### Sin conquered

"It is precisely in the Passion, when the mercy of Christ is about to vanquish it, that sin most clearly manifests its violence and its many forms. However, at the very hour of darkness, the hour of the prince of this world, the sacrifice of Christ secretly becomes the source from which the forgiveness of our sins will pour forth inexhaustibly." - Catechism, §1851



#### Humility rewarded

The point of our festival this weekend is to honour the King, Who entered His own capital as the Successor of David, to claim not political power but His eternal priesthood. Indeed He went not to the palace of the tetrarch Herod, or the residence of the Roman procurator Pilate, but straight to the Temple of His presence. Thus as the prophet Zechariah once said, the Shepherd-king arrived on a makeshift throne, made from an ass and a colt. The gospel of S. Matthew describes this better. The King thus arrived in His capital not to be triumphantly crowned as secular prince, but to establish a new priestly ritual: He Himself would be the victim to be sacrificed, Himself the altar of sacrifice, Himself the priest offering the sacrifice upon the altar. This later understanding of the Church is built upon a good and honourable Heart that gave of Itself for the men and women It so loved. A very human heart. In distress and pain, It called out the lines of Psalm 22: My God, My God, why have you forsaken Me? Thus our first reading and psalm. In utter humiliation, this Sacred Heart then offered the sacrifice that Adam, Eve and every other human being before Him had failed to offer: complete subjection to the Divine will. Thus our second reading. Humility is rewarded, as S. Paul tells us, because it is when we put ourselves in the lowest place that the Holy One beckons us higher.
