The Church in effect

The grand theme of our readings this weekend is the rapid growth of the Church in the wake of the Passion and the Resurrection of the Lord. Already at the foot of the Cross, S. John had noted with horror the opening of Christ's side with a spear, and the bursting forth of the Sacraments of Baptism and the Holy Eucharist in the water and blood. In our gospel reading this weekend, he notes with astonishment the birth of the Sacrament of Confession and Reconciliation, as the risen Christ gives authority to His Apostles to forgive sins in His name. The blessing of the Sacraments of the Church is given to those who believe in Christ and trust in His promises. As He Himself says at the end of this reading, the gift of faith extends down the generations, to you and me, who do not see and yet believe. From this faith and the streams of grace it brings, as S. John says in the second reading, the Church built. Through baptism, we are adopted sons and daughters of the Holy One and begotten by Him. Begotten of Him, we should love Him and demonstrate that love by following His commandments, as handed down to us in every generation by the teaching authority of His Church - in this way we shall conquer and overcome the spirit of this world the spirit of domination and possession and desire and power. The resulting freedom of the children of God is described powerfully by S. Luke in his Acts of the Apostles, which provides our first reading today. And we can summarise the marks of the Church thus presented, the Apostolic formula, from the first reading: humility, brotherly charity, respect for the hierarchical priesthood. From the second reading: seeking after faith and understanding. From the gospel reading: desiring forgiveness and the holiness that only Christ brings.
