# Shepherd not only the Jews

## Good shepherds for the Church

"Jesus entrusted a specific authority to Peter: 'I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven...' The 'power of the keys' designates authority to govern the house of God, which is the Church. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, confirmed this mandate after His Resurrection: 'Feed my sheep.'" - Catechism, §553



## The Shepherd-King as Father

The theme of the readings this weekend is the love of God always a paternal love. We do, after all, call Him Father in our most well-known prayer. What is the love of a father? If we are not human fathers, we may have the experience of a human father or have heard it described or witnessed it as a third party: the constant support and concern for the wellbeing of the child, the hand of discipline in youth and counsel later, the benevolence. Now, multiply this love infinitely, and you will find the Sacred Heart, who says to us today, I AM the Good Shepherd. Some 600 years before OLJC walked this earth in human form, God declared through the prophet Ezekiel that He would arrive Himself as Shepherd to the people, working together with a descendant of King David, the true king. This 'working together' took place marvellously in the fullness of time, when a strange being appeared as a child in Bethlehem of Judaea, the Holy One arrived to shepherd His people both as their divine Father, and in the form of the Davidic king as their human Brother. And He would rule their hearts, their wills voluntarily united to His. He would never abandon them, and would even give His life for them. Think of the love lavished upon us, S. John tells us in our second reading, that we can call the Creator of all things by the most familiar names given to earthly fathers. And this is possible because of the Sacred Heart, both human and divine, through which we are adopted by the Holy One. So S. Peter declares in the first reading that the most important stone in the edifice of the People of God is this Godman, both human and divine, Who brings communion between God and men, Who makes us beloved children of the Holy One.
