The new rites of Passover



The Sacrament of Love

The feast day of Corpus Christi is a celebration of the greatest gift given us by our Lord. Often during the Last Supper discourses, He promised to not leave His children as orphans after His Passion, Resurrection and Ascension. And then just before His Ascension, He did promise to be with us always, yes (He said), to the end of time. How would He do that? Well, we're looking at it, or rather at Him, every Mass that we attend. The first thing about Corpus Christi is therefore about the actual, physical presence before us of the Lord, daily, in so far as we are able to either attend Mass or visit the parish church and remain for however long before the tabernacle. The second thing about the feast day Corpus Christi is its celebration of eternal life. Our Lord once said to a mass of His Jewish followers that the life of the Father flows through Him and it would flow through them too, if they ate His flesh and drank His blood. The reception of Holy Communion thus becomes the condition of eternal rest and heaven and union with the Holy One at the end of our lives. If we show our love for Christ by following the commandments He gave us (as in the first reading this weekend), then He will come to us in Holy Communion and we shall have that eternal life He promised us. This was the whole point of the Incarnation of Christ - His taking on our humanity and becoming one of us. As the Fathers of the Church used to say, God became man in order than man may become divine. And it all became very real when the Lord sat down to His Last Supper, with His priests around Him, taking the bread and the wine up and saying, This is my Body, this is my Blood, the Blood of the covenant, by which heaven is now open to the children of Adam, by which the eternal life that Adam and Even once forfeited is now available once more to their children, My children, Whom I love, and for Whom I now give My life.
