Human shepherds may fail | The Good Shepherd triumphs | In Him is our comfort

The exhaustion of the Work



Shepherds after His heart

To be sheep

"I will fear no evil, for Thou dwellest in my heart by faith: and Thou art now with me, that after the shadow of death I too may be with Thee. Thy discipline [crook and staff], like a rod for a flock of sheep, and like a staff for children of some size, and growing out of the natural into spiritual life, they have not been grievous to me; rather have they comforted me: because Thou art mindful of me." - S. Augustine of Hippo, on Psalm 22(23)



Woe to the shepherds!

Just before the calamitous destruction of Jerusalem in 587BC, there were many among the priests, prophets and nobility who supported the king of Juda, and failed to condemn injustice and idolatry when this was the ordinary experience of the people. This made these false shepherds guilty of leading the sheep astray, as Jeremiah says in our first reading today. And whether or not we like to think of it, most people are sheep, following various shepherds, be they politicians, thinkers or (in our days) celebrities of various types, even sporting celebrities. And we have been let down severely by the shepherds of the Church in the last sixty or seventy years, in many ways. Apart from the several abuse scandals involving priests and Religious, there has been a more general failure of the teaching and judicial authority of the Church. The temptation to corruption is always present, the serpent from the garden is always curled around new trees, whispering into our ears that we don't need God, that we can be gods on our own, that we are who we make ourselves, etc. But the good news is that, when human shepherds fail, the Good Shepherd arrives, and Jeremiah also speaks of the Virtuous Branch of the line of David. Part of the integrity in the shepherd is hard-work and dedication to the life of the sheep, and in the gospel story this weekend we find the seminary for Christian shepherds: the men were exhausted, but Christ and His Twelve recognised that where the Jerusalem priesthood had again failed they were to provide guidance according to the Law of God. And so, let us pray always for our priests and bishops, because they are caught up continually in the cultures they live within and in the West today, that is a culture of anti-religion and secularism. Pray that our priests and bishops may be icons of the Good Shepherd, so that they too may guide us along the right path, be true to His Name, causing us to fear no evil in the most desperate places, for we should be able to find in every circumstance the crook and the staff of the Good Shepherd, which will be a comfort to us.
