### Humanity renewed

We are invited by our readings this weekend to understand the first messianic expectation, and how Jerusalem was to be glorified at last in Christ. The prophet Baruch, like other prophets, saw Jerusalem as dressed by God in glorious vestment, prepared as a bride for her Husband, Who is God. The vestment of glory clothed an integrity and a purity, especially from idolatry. When the people fell into sin and idolatry, they lost their purity. When they pretended to serve God in holiness while they were fallen deep into vice and the degradation of sin, they lost their integrity. The prophet is here calling the people to repentance and atonement with God. Arise, he says, stand upon the heights, take up your mantle of purity once more and the splendour that God once gave you and which is yours. Here is a theme of Advent: repent, return to purity before God, and He will bless us. But Jerusalem would not be glorified in the days of Baruch or any of the other prophets; rather, they were seeing far into the future. The eighth day of December is the day Catholics remember the Immaculate Conception, when the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared in the womb of her mother S. Anna. When God decided that He would be a man, and that He would be born of a Virgin, He proposed to take his humanity materially from this beautiful woman, the purest of all created things, conceived without sin. In the BVM at the moment of her conception, mercy and integrity returned fully to the human race, and we are left to marvel as God began to renew humanity, preparing all things for the glorification of Jerusalem that was to follow, in the life, death and resurrection of Christ. In the gospel story, Luke's clear historical background for the ministry of John the Baptist (and so of Christ) demonstrates that God works within history to call His people into being in Moses, build the Temple in Solomon, and fulfil the promises He once made to finally remake/sanctify humanity in Christ.
