

A WORD FROM FATHER KEVIN



ur readings on this great feast day of Corpus Christi focus in one way or another upon the great gift of Christ to us, the gift of Himself. This gift of bread and wine, His Body and Blood, which He gave for the first time at the Last Supper is linked directly to the Sacrifice on the cross the following day. This is perfect love: the pouring out of the life of a father - a parent - so that his (her) children may live. In the first reading, we hear an ancient echo of the gift of bread and wine in the story of Father Abraham and Melchisedech. In the second reading, we get the first narrative of the Last Supper, for this letter of S. Paul's was written long before the Gospels were read in the churches. In the gospel story, we find a miracle of the superabundant dividing of bread and fish among thousands. At Mass, today and until the end of time, we witness and live the superabundant dividing of Christ among us. May He blessed forever in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.
