A WORD FROM FATHER KEVIN



We talk about S. Peter very much on this feast day, because the Holy Father is the Successor of Peter and so inherits the Saint's governance of and supreme authority within the Church (as given by the keys). But from the earliest times, feast days of S. Peter (like the Chair of Peter in February) commemorated Paul and feast days of S. Paul (like the Conversion in January) commemorated Peter. They are the twin patron Saints of the Rome and the Latin Church and stand together.

Although the first reading and the gospel reading this weekend focus on S. Peter, we have an extract as our second reading from the very touching second letter of S. Paul to Timothy, his bishop in Ephesus; it was to be Paul's final letter, he was about to be executed, as he clearly states. We see in this short reading further qualities of the bishop of Rome, the Pope, who could also perhaps be called the Successor of Paul. I shall call them out: (a) perseverance until the end, (b) his keeping the Church in mind throughout his suffering, (c) his finding his strength both physical and spiritual in Christ, and (d) his supernatural hope. May the holy Apostles S. Peter and S. Paul pray for us.
