A WORD FROM FATHER KEVIN



le are centred as Catholics upon God, and not upon humanity. It is God Who gives us our dignity and makes us holy. If we ignore God or set His Law aside and claim to have a morality that is determinedly atheistic and humanist, as in our modern world, we lose the traditional understanding of human dignity atrocities arrive, the scale of which can be unbelievable. until we hear of the catastrophes of the last century. So, we must return to God, both individually and as a society. Father Abraham in our first reading shows hospitality to God - he obviously recognises the divine figures standing and his generosity is before him -

reciprocated, for his wife will now give birth to his true heir at the age of ninety! In the gospel story, we find that S. Mary makes the choice of the contemplation of the face of God in Christ, while her sister busies herself with the housekeeping. S. Martha is indignant, but our Lord says Mary has chosen better. There's a little bit of Mary and a little bit of Martha in all of us, and we must prioritise well. So, while we focus on charity to our families, friends and others (as Martha), let us not neglect prayer and devotion (as Mary). S. Paul in the second reading demonstrates how all the good we do and the evil we suffer may be united with the work of Christ Himself.
