

A WORD FROM FATHER KEVIN



hether we look at the modern world or the ancient world or anything in between, pride and the desire for power over other people is commonly found in our race. If our Lord chided the Pharisees and the Temple scribes for their superficiality and their seeking after glory in the way they held themselves in public, He in our gospel reading today addresses their attempt to seizehonour for themselves.

This doesn't only concern the priests and teachers in the Church, of course, but every one of us. And it doesn't only concern honour, which is given from above, but it concerns also power, which is also ultimately God's. He sets those who rule over us in this world in their place, and asks us to suffer them. But as in the story we have, He expects us to take the lowest place, and He will lift us up out of it. When He says that whoever exalts himself will be humbled and whoever humbles himself will be exalted, He is practically reading the Law of Moses out and admonishing the proud Pharisees for failing yet again in their observance of that Law. I shall end by naming the most humble of the children of men, our blessed Lady, who in her great song the Magnificat said, He Who is mighty has done great things for me... He has put down the mighty and exalted the humble.
