#### A WORD FROM FATHER KEVIN



I saiah is the prophet of Advent. In our first reading this weekend, the prophet places the mountain of the Jewish Temple higher than every other mountain. Since the high places were where ancient peoples climbed to offer sacrifices, the various mountains represented religions. The prophet is elevating the Jewish religion over every other, and Christ does the same when He says to a Samaritan woman that Salvation comes from the Jews. He is that Salvation, and His very name means Godsaves. When does the Jewish religion tower over every other, lifted higher than every other? On a cross, outside the gates of Jerusalem. The prophet goes on... when this happens, when the cross is raised, all the tribes of mankind will stream to the foot of the cross, and the Holy One of Israel will rule their hearts... from a cross... But that rule of His over our hearts depends always upon our cooperation. And that brings us back to the theme of vigilance against sin, and Paul's warning in the second reading that we do not return to lives of sin, as a dog returns to its own vomit. For, if we leave the practice of religion to return to lives of vice, it will be as the gospel reading says, and we shall be badly surprised when Christ returns. So, stay awake, and stay ready...
