A WORD FROM FATHER KEVIN



Let's look at the picture of the Holy Family in our gospel reading this weekend. The tiny Infant and His mother are extremely vulnerable, and heaven is not absent to them. Angels are everywhere. Beyond all else, the salvation of the human race hangs upon the

survival of the Child, and heaven has appointed a protector in the quiet S. Joseph, a man whose tireless devotion to his wife and to the Child is evident in his efforts to protect them from Herod and then from Herod's son Archelaus. There is no doubt that this guardian figure is the head of the household, and takes up the role of father to the God-man Himself, Who we told later on submits in humility to the rule of His mother and S. Joseph. Humility was the mark of Christ, from infancy and childhood, and until the torture of the Cross. Humility was the mark of His holy Mother, all of her life. Humility was the mark of S. Joseph, who served the Lady and her Child faithfully. So, we shall learn from them faith in the Father God, persistent charity in our relationships, and the humility to submit to each other in charity.
