S. Paul's emphasis in all that he endured for the sake of Christ and the Church was always on love, on charity. Our second reading this weekend is from his letter to the Corinthians, and he urges reconciliation and forgiveness among the faction-ridden Corinthian Christians. The spirit of charity would unite them in a common belief and practice, and it would also give them a common purpose, even the mission work that the bishops are urging upon us in our own times. We too can often be discouraged by politics within the Church, and this has been rife for sixty years and more. But we cannot be for this priest or for that, for this bishop or for that, for this pope or for that. We are simply for Christ, Who should be our primary focus, our great Light. As it says in our first reading this weekend and in our gospel reading, the great Light rises out of the darkness of pagan unbelief in the former Hebrew territories of Zebulun and Naftali. This land had become known even in the time of Isaiah as 'Galilee of the Gentiles,' Galilee of the unbelievers. But Nazareth lies in the middle of Galilee. And our churches and communities, our families and we ourselves - we temples of the Holy Ghost - we lie in the middle of the Galilee of our times. Let us then be a light for the souls Christ loves.
