Let's use the gospel story this weekend to bring together the other readings that we have. Christ says to us in His sermon on the mount, at the beginning of the gospel of S. Matthew, that we are the salt of the earth, but if that salt should lose its savour it should be tossed aside. We know some salts that have no savour; they sit at the bottom of our kettles. And we know the salt which has preserved our food for centuries. Should not our lives of Christian virtue - cultivated with charity, humility, integrity, etc. - should these not be constantly charged, bringing joy to the world around us? The Lord says that this light that burns within us should be on a hill-top, or (practically speaking) on the streets outside, not seeking its own glory, but the glory of the God Who is its source. We may know very much, like S. Paul, but if we cannot bring it to use for the bettering somehow of the lives of the people around us, what good is it? We could perhaps end with that psalm that is sandwiched so well between the readings. It is simply another version of the first reading from Isaiah: the righteous and honourable person fearlessly works for the poor, a light in the darkness, with God as his/her foundation.
