## A WORD FROM FATHER KEVIN



**T**he two disciples at Emmaus found Christ in the breaking of the bread. And so shall we, if we take His word for it. He had said that He would be with us always, yes, to the very end of the age. How would He manage that, if He was determined to ascend and return to His Father? There is a mystery there, and that mystery we Catholics call the Blessed Sacrament: the very presence of the Holy One in the heart of our churches, within us, around us. Saint Luke left us two writings, his gospel, and his Acts of the Apostles. In both, he speaks of the ‘breaking of the bread,’ and it seems obvious that he means the

Holy Eucharist. In our gospel story today, he tells us that Cleopas and his friend kept the mysterious Stranger over. Why did they? He had been preaching to them from the Hebrew Bible all the way from Jerusalem, opening to their intellects the oracles of the prophets. They were discovering Him anew, and they wanted to know more. True religion is not about letters in a book though, it is about communion with a Person. After the Word comes the Eucharist. When we have found out about Christ from many sources, at Holy Communion He now comes to find us.
